Our children have been passionate about events they would like to see in school. We are working our way through different events they have shared with us. The first up, is a Bake Sale! ## **School of Sanctuary**

As part of our school sanctuary focus, we discussed the different reasons as to why people might have to flee their homes. We looked at the different definitions for refugees and asylum seekers. We talked at length about how to make everyone feel welcome in our school and how we can make a difference to the lives of others. The ideas we came up with were: always saying hello and goodbye, smiling at others, including people in games and class discussions, and just being kind and helpful to everyone we meet.

At the end of the assembly we looked at a story about a refugee. He told us about leaving most of his belongings behind. Next time we meet as a school, we will talk about the things he did take with him and we will talk about the things we might take with us if we had to flee our homes.

## **Eco Project Update**

We continue our drive to improve the school grounds. Flower beds have been prepared using a 'no dig bed' ready for planting! Our Eco-committee have been meeting regularly with Mrs Terry and are at the heart of driving the development of our grounds. All children have had an opportunity to discuss and plan what we will plant in our beds during the spring term. We look forward to hearing what the Eco-committee select from our ideas! Lots of very exciting ideas were put forward when applying and we look forward to seeing them blossom.

## **Curriculum and Enrichment**

### **Year R**

#### **English**

This term in Literacy we have been learning about rhyming! We have enjoyed reading and writing about Oi Frog! We have learned about frogs on a log, cats on a mat, moles on poles and a dog in a bog. They have enjoyed making up their own rhymes and applying their phonic knowledge.

Over the next two weeks of term, the children will be reading a range of dragon related books, including 'Zog', and they will describe their own dragons and write a recount of a story.

#### **Maths**

We have enjoyed our number of the week and now we are learning to apply our knowledge in time, adding, subtracting and measurement. We will be learning how to subtract by finding one less practically and will be exploring number bonds to 5.

### **Year 1**

#### **Phonics**

WOW - What a week! Our Fun Phonics Workshops have been a huge success. We had lots of parents come and join us as we used Retrieval Rex to recall and explore the first 12 sounds in the Green Phase. Pip and Pap, our Alien friends helped us to learn the sounds and the actions and segment and blend them within a word. We then applied our learning by reading books, including 'The Stray Dog' and 'The Hawk'. We looked at how we can become more accurate with our reading and practiced following with our finger to support the identification of sounds.

We introduced our pace pea and how to use it to support us with our reading:

1. Read it the first time, focusing on blending and pointing with each finger to recognise the sounds.
2. Re-read a little quicker, looking at the digraphs and Earth words that are used.
3. Re-read the whole sentence with accuracy.



We ended with an exciting task - to create our own stray dog and we decorated it using tissue paper, paper plates and colourful pens.

### Year 2

#### Writing

ZZZZZZZZZ... Don't panic, it isn't the Year 2's that are asleep! It is Moz the Monster under the bed! Since finding out this information, the Year 2 children have been really excited to use their writing skills to build up tension and keep the reader in suspense. So far, the children have been practicing their descriptive writing and have explored how to use adjectives for effect.



Over the next two weeks, we will be reading 'How to catch a star' and creating our own star catchers. Will we be able to persuade the reader to want to buy it?

#### RE

Year 2 have been exploring what special means and applying this to a special moment, place, person or object. We have also been considering how each of us are special in our own way. We have related our own ideas to religions such as Christianity and Hinduism and will end our unit of work over the next couple of weeks by thinking about how key influential figures in society are special and what they have said or done to show this.

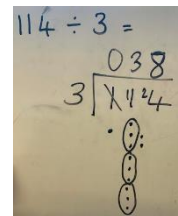

In writing, we have been enjoying Dahl's 'Fantastic Mr Fox'! We have loved exploring the evil farmers and have created our own farmer in this style for our character description! During the next couple of weeks, we will be putting ourselves in the farmer's shoes and writing in the first person.

## Year 6

### English: Upon the Heath...

In writing, we have been using high-level vocabulary and figurative language to describe Macbeth's meeting of the three witches upon the heath. We have focussed on building tension through the gradual approach of a storm and how the characters respond to the gathering, menacing weather.

Some of us have written from a different perspective: an observer on the heath - perhaps a raven or an ancient tree. We will build the setting description to a climax, whereupon the three ghastly witches are revealed and meet Macbeth, sharing with him their deadly prophecy. A key focus in our final section will be to create a careful balance of action, description and dialogue. This will enable us to characterise these beings in a variety of ways.

## REMINDERS

### Lateness

We appreciate the commitment from the vast majority of our parents who ensure their children arrive promptly for registration and collect them promptly at the end of the day. This substantially reduces stress and anxiety for the children. We also appreciate that on occasion traffic and extenuating circumstances mean that lateness is unavoidable. Should you need to make alternative arrangements for the collection of your child at the end of the day please ensure you telephone the school office before 3.00pm. Our admin team are unable to leave the office after this time unless in an emergency.



## Leave of Absence from School

Penalty notices will be issued for family holidays taken in term time or for 5 unauthorised days off over half a term. A penalty notice means a cost of £60 per parent per child if paid in the first two weeks, then £120 per parent per child for the next 4 weeks. The parents may then be taken to court – this will lead to a find and court costs.

## Children cycling to school

Please make sure your children wear cycle helmets and have lights on their bikes. As the evenings are still dark, please discuss with them the importance of returning home promptly.

## P.E. Kit reminder

We go out and about when it is cold so please ensure your child has a suitable P.E kit in school at all times and check their P.E shoes fit them comfortably. Joggers are very useful to keep those muscles warm! As with all uniform clear name labels are important so that any lost items can be returned to their owners. Please remember to take your child's P.E kit home at the end of each half term to wash ready for the next half term.

Please also ensure that earrings are taped or removed **before school and kit is in school**, we wouldn't want anyone to miss out!

## School packed lunches

Children having a packed lunch are encouraged to bring a healthy lunch box. Please do not include sweets and chocolate. The amount you put in your child's lunch box should be what they would usually eat for a sandwich type lunch. Please name your child's lunch box! And remember we are a NUT FREE school.
