## Curriculum and enrichment

### Year R

During this term, Year R has been exploring the life cycles of different animals. In science, we enjoyed looking at different eggs and using our predicting skills to make a clever guess as to which animal might hatch from the different eggs. In writing, we have been deepening our knowledge of non-fiction books to write a recount of the different stages of our favourite animal's life cycle. In maths, we are deepening our understanding of numbers. We have explored new ways of counting in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10 using resources to work out the best ways of counting them.

### Year 1

Our Year 1 children have been enjoying many new learning opportunities and challenges this half term so far!

We were challenged to enter a competition like no other ... to compete and win the title of the BEST super vegetable in Mansel Park School. We took on the challenge and designed our own powerful super vegetable. We then developed our persuasive techniques to give us the best chance of being a successful competition winner. Look out ... we are now experts in the art of persuasion! In DT, we have been using our History knowledge of the features of castles. This helped us to design and create a protective castle within our groups. We worked hard to plan and think about what materials and joining mechanisms would be suitable for each feature to ensure the structure was strong and sturdy. We were very successful!

## Year 2

This term in Year 2, the children have been immersed in exciting and creative learning experiences. They have embarked on a captivating journey by recreating their own letters inspired by "The Day the Crayons Quit," using imaginative expanding noun phrases and effective subordinating conjunctions. The children have become history detectives and have been exploring the gripping events of the Great Fire of London and its historical timeline. With great enthusiasm, they took on the role of reporters and crafted their own newspaper reports, transporting themselves back in time to witness and report on this significant event. Their dedication and hard work were truly commendable. Additionally, in

Maths, the children have been exploring measurements such as mass and height. Through engaging activities, they have developed their understanding of these concepts, allowing them to confidently compare and measure objects. It has been an enriching and successful term of learning for Year 2!

## Year 3

Year 3 has been working really hard on the Big Help Out, which was part of our learning for the King's Coronation. We focused on recycling and we had monitors to check that every class in the school was putting appropriate items into the recycling bin. We made posters for the bins to ensure that the teachers and children knew which items can be recycled. We are excited to continue with this throughout the year and help our planet as much as possible! We have also had lots of fun in Science learning all about plants. We have learned about what plants need to survive. We set up an experiment where we had a control plant, a plant with no water and a plant with no sunlight. We observed that the leaves on the plant with no water were brown and dry because they did not have enough water to help them grow!

## Year 4

In English, Year 4 are writing diary entries to tell a 'rags to riches' story, inspired by magical plots such as Matilda, Cinderella and Aladdin. We will also be writing explanation texts for inventions inspired by Chitty Chitty Bang Bang at the end of term. In Maths, we are covering reading clocks and calculating time durations, before moving on to statistics (bar charts and pictograms) and consolidating content from the year. Our Science topic builds on skills for working scientifically and designing our own experiments, whilst in Geography we are looking at water use and treatment - from Roman aqueducts, to Victorian engineering, to modern day water facilities. We are also looking forward to designing and building our bug hotels in DT!

## Year 5

The Year 5's have been working so hard this term! In Writing, the children have been creating their own spy narrative based on the book 'Stormbreaker' by Anthony Horowitz. Previously, the children have invented their own spy gadgets and wrote an informative and persuasive piece of writing all about it! Shhhhh... It's confidential! Soon, they will be incorporating their gadget within their spy story.

In Geography, we have started our new topic all about maps. The children have discovered just how many different types of maps there really are! By the end of the topic, the children will be able to give directions using compass directions and grid references to help someone stranded on a mountain.

Meanwhile, in Science, the children continue to explore how to carry out a fair test, this includes planning for the independent, dependent and control variables. So far we have tested which substances dissolve in water but there is much more to come!

### Year 6

It's been a busy half-term for our Year 6s who have been writing speeches and non chronological reports about a topic that's important to them. Some of the topics have included racism, gender inequality and climate change. The children completed research and thought carefully about how to

create impact through their language choices and sentence construction. The final products were both informative and persuasive. Well done Year 6!

In Science, the children have learnt about microorganisms and have even been growing some of their own - who knew mould can grow into such a variety of colours! We've also dived deep into the work of the 18th century scientist, Carl Linnaeus, and discovered the work he developed on identifying, naming and classifying organisms. We even had a go at creating some classification diagrams of our own using liquorice allsorts - yum!
