Dear Parents and Carers,

# **Curriculum and Enrichment**

## Nursery

In the nursery, we have been having fun exploring and investigating the garden. We have all planted 3 sunflower seeds and are watching them grow. These will then be going home with each child during the week of the 22nd of May to continue the awe and wonder of a growing flower. Our 2 year olds have created their very own shape biscuits, they were super yummy!

We have had great fun celebrating the King's coronation. We created bunting and all made a crown to help us decorate the nursery and ourselves ready for a special coronation picnic cafe. We shared many different King stories; our 2 favourite stories were 'The king's pants' by Nicholas Allan and 'The king's coronation' by Marion Billet.

### Year R

In Year R we have been learning all about people who help us. We had a very special visit from the fire service. We got to see the amazing protective fire gear and learnt all about fire safety. In history, we have learnt about significant people! We did lots of fun activities linked to the king's coronation! We even had a street party! We loved making all the decorations and learning about our new King. This half term, our role play corner has been a party for the King and we have been pretending to have a tea party for him. We have been learning all about plants and planting seeds. Our new focus is on minibeasts, we have been going on minibeast hunts, looking at minibeast books and solving minibeast themed problems solving questions in maths.

## Year 1

Have you seen what has happened in our school hall? Well, let us tell you... The Super Veg were stuck due to Evil Pea! In writing this term, we have been creating our very own Super Veggies! We have described our Super Veggies using wow words and our best language choices. In Maths this term, we have been learning about fractions. First, we found fractions within shapes and then we found fractions of amounts. We used lots of different practical resources to support us in finding half and a quarter. In History, we have been learning about Castles, we particularly enjoyed learning about the defensive features of Castles. In DT, we are going to be designing and creating our own Castle based upon our learning in History. We are so excited to start creating these using recycled materials!

# Year 2

During our topic learning, Year 2 thoroughly enjoyed learning all about the Great Fire of London that happened in 1666, which they deemed to be 'a very long time ago'! We were shocked to learn that they didn't have fire engines or fire fighters back then so the people who lived there had to help fight the fire! In Science, we have been learning about minibeasts and their habitats. In the next few weeks we will be going on lots of minibeast hunts... we can't wait to see what we find! We will be starting a new writing topic in May all about the story 'The Day the Crayons Quit.' We are keeping our fingers crossed that none of our stationary quit! In Maths we are beginning to learn how to tell the time, we are time experts, particularly with 'o'clock' and 'half past' and we are continuing to practise our quarter past and quarter to!

# Year 3

Can you imagine being abandoned in a desolate park in the middle of the night? This term, year 3 have been using their imagination to consider how Edward Tulane (a character from our writing topic) felt when this happened to him. The children have explored different techniques to build tension and engage our reader whilst using a range of features from their creative toolkits. We have been excited about sharing their pieces with their peers to show how they've used their own voice to build suspense. We are looking forward to sharing our final pieces with the year 4 adults and children.

### Year 4

There is no planet B! Year 4 have shown an inspirational amount of passion towards climate change. During our unit in writing this term, we have been learning all about climate change and completing research to deepen our understanding of the dire issue that plagues our planet currently. The children were hooked in by 'Greta and The Giants' by Zoe Tucker and they quickly realised that us humans are referred to as the giants - which understandably devastated them. The children have been using their research, their new learning and new passion to create a powerful and inspirational speech to address our man-made climate issue and to raise awareness.

#### Year 5

Year 5 have been exploring different types of measurement in maths. We have been out using the trundle wheels, measuring the school field to see just how big a kilometre is! We have learnt to accurately read scales using grams and kilograms, as well as estimating the capacity of a jug. We are now able to convert accurately between the different units of measurement. In writing we have become gadget designers. We have learnt all about the spy genre and why a spy needs gadgets. Next time to see an ordinary, everyday object don't be fooled! It may well be a state-of-the-art spy gadget.

## Year 6

We are incredibly proud of all of our children's skills, abilities and incredible passionate personalities here at Mansel Park. We are all so proud of all the children for their hard work, dedication and resilience during this year. As you are aware, Year 6 have been very busy preparing and sitting their SATs. We thank you for being their calm and supportive space. I am sure you will join us in commending them upon all of their efforts and achievements on their time here at Mansel Park beyond the academic measure of SATs. We look forward to celebrating their primary achievements in a variety of ways over the coming months. During the upcoming half-term, our students will engage in rehearsals for a full-scale production, which we eagerly anticipate sharing with you at the culmination of Summer 2.
